

Update: Work on Code of Ethics Continues

The comment period for the draft of the Code of Ethics closes on Friday, February 15. The draft is available to members on the Forum website in the Standards Toolbox at <http://www.forumea.org/standards-toolbox.cfm>. Comments should be sent to info@forumea.org. Following the comment period, members' input will be reviewed and the final document will be released in early March. Forum members and Boston conference attendees will receive a published copy of the Code of Ethics.

Additional sessions focusing on topics of the Code of Ethics have been added to the conference schedule. Conference attendees will have more opportunities for active dialogue of ethical practices in education abroad, including topics such as Ethical Study Abroad Pricing; Conducting and Participating in Ethical Site Visits; Ethical Guidelines for Service on Advisory Boards; and Ethical Guidelines for Approving Programs.
